## **Topics**

- What they don't teach you in Business School: While you are taught many things and get a good exposure to a wide range of topics, real life experience teaches you some very different things. I would like to share my experiences with you so that you get a head start and don't have to wait for 30 years to figure it out.
- 2. <u>Interview Skills</u>: Getting a job, fortunately or unfortunately, always starts with an interview.
